COVID-19 Case Trends - Historical Trends


While the COVID-19 Delta Variant continues to be active in the Santa Cruz County community and throughout the country, overall cases continue to decrease.

- As of 10/12/21, data shows a -31% change in average number of cases in the last 14 days, compared to 2 weeks ago when it was at a -21% change in cases.
- Case rates closely mirror COVID-19 cases at this time last year.
- COVID-19 hospitalizations, ICU need, and daily death rate are all in decline and projected to decline over the next 4 weeks.
- Majority of active cases were exposed in the community (60%) or household (20%).
- The <u>Local Demographics Dashboard</u> shows that among active cases, 26% were in the O to 19 age group, with the most cases in the 5 to 9 age range.

COVID-19 Vaccine Additional Dose Vs. Booster Dose

Additional Dose:

- Given to those with weakened immune systems who have not responded fully to initial doses.
- **28 days** after primary series.
- People who are moderately or severely immune compromised.
 Conditions listed here.
- Under FDA Emergency
 Use Authorization for
 approved individuals
 who received Moderna
 or Pfizer-BioNTech for
 primary series.

Booster Dose:

- Given when immune response to initial vaccination might have decreased over time.
- 6 months after primary series.
- People who **should** receive a booster dose:
 - Age 65+
 - Residents in long-term care settings (18+)
 - Age 50-64 years with <u>underlying</u> <u>medical conditions</u> or at risk of social inequities.
- People who **may** receive a booster shot:
 - Age 18-49 with <u>underlying medical</u> conditions.
 - Age 18-64 at risk for COVID-19 due to work or institutional setting.
- Under FDA Emergency Use Authorization for approved individuals who received **Pfizer-BioNTech** for primary series.
