🗧 COVID-19 Case Trends

COVID-19 case rates continue to decline in Santa Cruz County, with almost the same daily case rate as this time last year.

- As of 10/20/21, data shows a -23% change in average number of cases in the last 14 days, compared to 2 weeks ago when it was at a -21% change in cases.
- COVID-19 hospitalizations, ICU need, and daily death rate are all in decline and projected to decline over the next few weeks.
- Majority of known cases since 7/1/2021 were exposed in the community (60.43%) or household (21.72%).
- The <u>Local Demographics Dashboard</u> shows that among active cases, the most number of cases are in the 35–44 age range (16.98%), followed by the 25–34 age range (15.12%)

- Felton: Friday-Sunday from 10am-6pm at the Mountain Resource Center. *appointments preferred, walk-ins accommodated based on availability.



Healthy Partnership Spotlight

This week, Public Health and the Medical Reserve Corps partnered with a local residential care facility to provide COVID-19 vaccines and education with staff and residents.

In one afternoon, over **80** COVID-19 vaccines have been provided within this congregate care setting due to this partnership.

Throughout the COVID-19 Pandemic, the Santa Cruz County Medical Reserve Corps' Vaccine Strike Team has provided vaccinations to homebound and vulnerable populations (<u>click for more information</u>).



Vaccinations

On 10/22/2021, the <u>Western States Scientific Safety Review</u> <u>Workgroup</u> approved Expanded Eligibility for COVID-19 Vaccine Boosters. for use in California. This follows the <u>Center for Disease</u> <u>Control (CDC) endorsing of Advisory Committee on</u> <u>Immunization Practices</u> (ACIP) <u>recommendations</u> on 10/21. The expanded criteria includes:

- Moderna and Pfizer-BioNTech booster doses for the following 6 months after their primary series:
 - 65 years and older
 - Age 18+ who live in long-term care settings, underlying medical conditions or work or live in high-risk settings.
- Individuals 18+ who received **Johnson and Johnson**, two or more months prior.
- Eligible individuals may choose which vaccine they receive as a booster dose.
